Oregon students' response to "Most students are friendly to me."

- → HS Students: 60%
- → MS Students: 55%








Are students friendly to you? (Elementary School Students)




Are students friendly to you? (Disaggregated by gender identity)




When you are upset, is there an adult from school you can talk to?




When you are upset, is there an adult from school you can talk to? (disaggregated by race/ethnicity)











I really feel like a part of my school's community. (Middle School Students, disaggregated by LGBTQ+ Identity and Identify as POC)


















Students from my school treat adults with respect. (Oregon high school students disaggregated by race/ethnicity)
